Summary -

Are the stories of the Bible relevant to our time? How do we deal with crises and failures? What are the differences and similarities between the lives of our ancestors and our lives here in Israel, in the modern world?

The film "Until This Day" deals with Itzhak facing the challenges of settling in the land of Gerar and contributes to studying this biblical chapter considering the events of today.

The movie includes a lesson plan

The lesson plan is based on the three following questions:

What is in it? = the content in this chapter

What is at its heart? = the main idea that is at the heart of the chapter

What is in it for me? = Where the chapter touches me and is relevant for me.

Guided viewing of the movie -

The lesson plan includes an offer for guided viewing of the movie. This will enable students to get the most out of it even if their historical memory does not yet recognize the various events mentioned within.

Main themes -

The lesson plan suggests expanding on the discussion and delving into the following points:

- a. "The deeds of the forefathers are signs for their descendants" what our ancestors experienced is an inspiration and a sign for us.
- b. "The eternal nation does not fear a long road" to be a believing Jew means to be patient and long-suffering; God's promises are not always fulfilled immediately and in the way we expect.
- c. Faith and courage to be a believer and remain courageous in the time of Itzhak, as well as today, means to hold onto the ground and the land, and continue believing courageously even when it does not work out and you are forced to go and dig and find another well.

Important note -

This movie before us wishes to be very topical yet not political. We recommend the teacher not let the class discussion become political, but rather reach a place of dealing with national and personal crises.
